The module CO2002 (10 credits, 2017/18 and previous years) is being replaced by a module CO1109 in 2018/19 of 15 credits.

Students due to take CO2002 in 2018/19 will take CO1909 in 2018/19. CO1909 is also a 10 credit module; but its content is exactly that of CO1109.

This was agreed, following a consultation with affected students by an email dated 28/04/2018, that since all students who were due to take CO2002 will be at level 2, 10 credits will be awarded for the study of a 15 credit level 1 module (coded CO1909 but effectively CO1109).
